PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The following information is to inform property owners of what the Board is working on for 2011. These improvements will increase property values and give visitors a better impression of Hilltop Lakes.

The Board passed the following goals for 2011:

1. Build a community center/Post Office
2. General manager search
3. Road improvements
4. Finance:
 - a. Increase emergency fund
 - b. Every department will stay within budget
 - c. Complete salary analysis
5. Purchase an emergency warning system for Hilltop
6. General Improvements:
 - a. Improve hotel and villas
 - b. Improve campgrounds
 - c. Replace blinds in Tonkawa Room
 - d. Improve picnic and playground areas
 - e. Improve putt-putt golf course
7. Review Contracts:
 - a. Security contract
 - b. Post Office contract
8. Complete plan to move water from Swan Lake to Tonkawa Lake
9. Personnel Handbook training
10. Increase outside golf tournaments
11. Complete plan to hire summer (part time) workers
12. Complete cell tower

The major talk at Hilltop Lakes the past few months has been the gas wells and the gas pipeline that will

be installed, this year, at Hilltop Lakes. I have not talked to anyone at Hilltop Lakes who wants the gas wells drilled in our neighborhood because we are not receiving royalties from these wells.

In 1998 the POA signed a land usage agreement with Mr. Belin when we purchased the property. Mr. Belin kept 20 well sights and a perpetual easement to drill a gas well (Belin #2) at Hilltop Drive and Acapulco in November of 2010. The POA board tried to stop this drilling. Our gas and oil attorney, in Houston, told us that Gastar and Mr. Belin had crossed their "T" and dotted their "I" and we could not stop the drilling. The board did work out a land usage agreement with Gastar that they would use the back roads to enter the well site. Gastar paid Hilltop Lakes \$30,000 to use a small tract of Hilltop land to complete the road. Gastar is now in the process of drilling another gas well (Belin #3) in the horse pasture near the maintenance barn.

To drill a gas well Gastar has to drill water wells to supply water to the drilling site. We were able to work out with Gastar that these wells be drilled on Hilltop Lakes Water Supply Corporation and Hilltop Lakes property. When the gas wells are complete these water wells will become the property of the Water Supply Corporation and Hilltop Lakes POA.

Gastar is in the process of putting in a gas pipeline to remove the gas from these wells. The pipeline

from Belin #2 will be installed down Hilltop Drive to the airport and go north off Hilltop Lakes property. The pipeline from Belin #3 will be installed across the horse pasture and connect with the pipeline at the airport. After many hours of negotiations, with Gastar, they have agreed to pay Hilltop Lakes \$150,000 to put the pipeline on Hilltop Lakes property. All monies received from Gastar has been placed in a special building account to be used to improve Hilltop Lakes.

The Board has approved a contract to pave Hilltop Drive to the maintenance entrance and Tonkawa East to the Campground. This work should begin after April 15, 2011 when the weather warms up.

Your board has been working hard to cut expenses and make every dollar go as far as possible. Your support and suggestions are needed to make Hilltop Lakes an even better place to live and play.

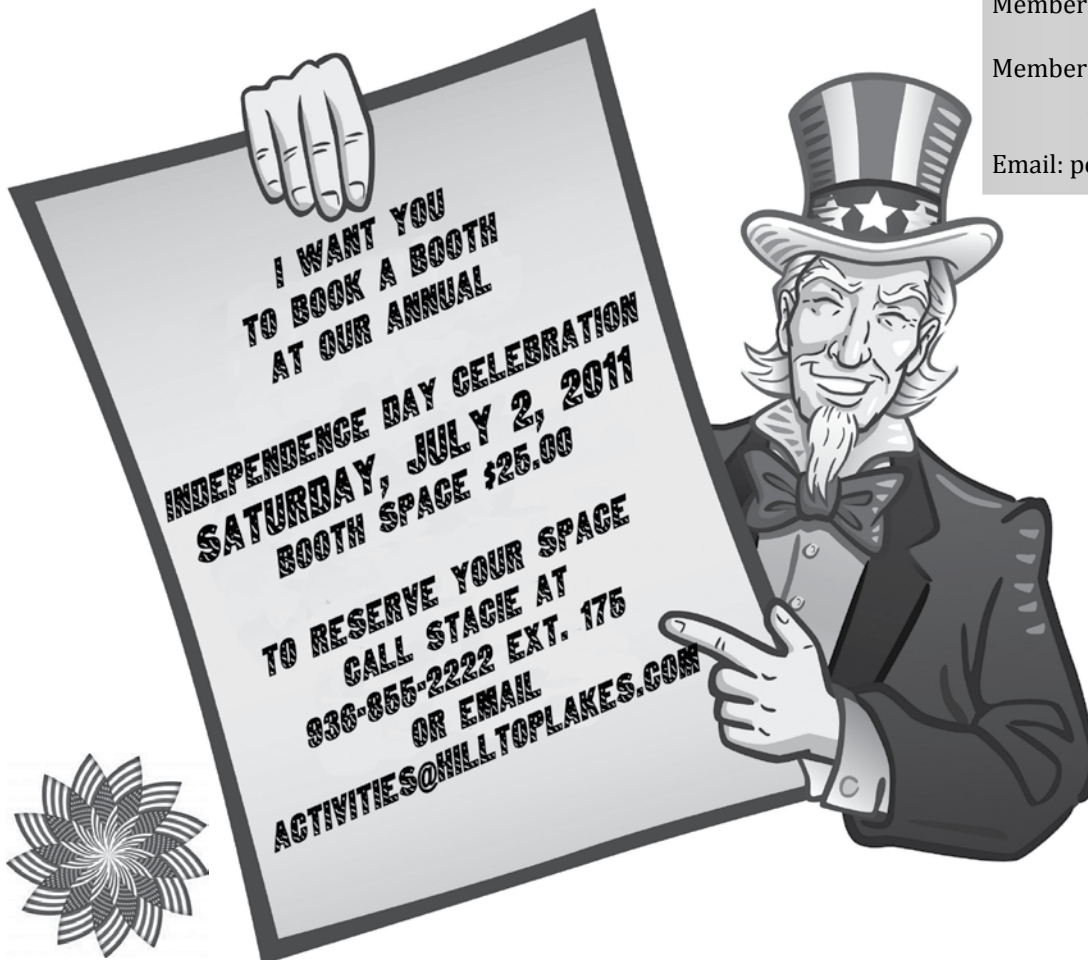

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

The ACC and POA Board of Directors felt that the PERMIT FEES for building new houses, clearing lots, etc. were unfair. Therefore, the POA Board has approved a new policy which changes "permit fees" to PERMIT DEPOSITS. Please don't forget to get permits for fences, patios, gazebos, additions, storage buildings, slabs, and other projects. If completed according to approved specifications and within time frame of permit (12 months for houses and 6 months for other projects), your permit deposit will be returned. This deposit will be an incentive for property owners

to complete houses within a reasonable length of time. On smaller projects (not houses), your check will be held as long as possible and returned if the project is completed within permit time limit. These permits will assure that all projects meet deed restrictions and will keep Hilltop Lakes the beautiful place it is. Thank you for your continued cooperation in obtaining permits. Permits for houses will be \$2,000. All other permits will be \$150.

For Your Convenience

We now have a credit card machine at the Post Office to make your purchasing more convenient.

Changes of Address

The fastest, easiest, and most convenient way to change your address with the Postal Service is with Mover's Guide online, available on the Postal Service website at www.usps.com/moversguide.

To use Mover's Guide online, you need an e-mail address and to prevent fraud the Postal Service charges \$1 via credit card to verify identities. Or you can always come by the Post Office.

Reminders

Outside Box: Mail is collected at 1:30 p.m. weekdays and 11:45 a.m. on Saturday by the Post Office staff. Mail can still be deposited, and will be collected at 4:15 p.m., Monday thru Friday and Saturday at 2:45p.m. by the truck driver.

Inside Boxes: Mail may be deposited into the inside boxes until 2:00 p.m. weekdays and 12 noon on Saturday to go the same day. Any mail deposited after these times will not go out until the following day.

Top slot is for missent mail, box rent due notices, stamps by mail, and going out of town slips.

Bottom is for out of town mail

Local Mail can be placed in the box on the counter inside the Post Office or slipped under the mail door of Post Office. This is for Hilltop mail only.

The Forever Stamp (Liberty Bell) is good indefinitely on First-Class one ounce letter, regardless of price increases.

Service

We know that business isn't just 9 to 5, Monday thru Friday. Call, e-mail, fax, or use the order forms at the Post Office lobby for postage stamps, shipping supplies, or just need information.

Postage Stamps are payable upon delivery by cash, check, or credit card. Your stamps will be left in your P.O. Box the same day.

Important

Due to instructions from the Norman-gee Post Office all mail addressed to physical addresses must be returned to the sender. If you receive any mail with a handwritten P.O. Box number on it, you must have that address corrected with the vendor. You will be given a short time to correct the addresses with your vendors.

Box Rent

When you received your Box Due Notice, you have the entire month plus 10 days in the next month to pay. If you do not pay within that time, you will be charge a \$15.00 late fee.

Notice

Renewal time has come for the Blue Handicap Flags. Anyone wishing to have a Blue Handicap Flag for your golf cart needs to be aware of our policy and procedures for acquiring one. To receive a flag you must demonstrate in one or two methods:

- 1.) Have a handicap parking authorization issued by the DMV
- 2.) Have a doctor's authorization.

Bring proof of either of these to the Pro Shop so your name can be added to the approved flag list. Golfer will also need to read the Blue Flag Policy and sign the Medical Blue Flag Policy form, witnessed by the Pro Shop Manager or Hilltop Lakes General Manager. Each handicap flag issued will be reviewed every 6 months on January 1st and July 1st.

Should a blue medical flag be needed on a temporary basis, it will be issued at the discretion of the Pro Shop Manager. The flag will be issued for one day and be returned to the Pro Shop upon completion of the round of golf. Person requesting flag must present Doctor's or DMV authorization.

Abuse of this policy may result in cancellation of the handicap flag privilege repeated violations may result in suspension of golf privileges as determined by the Hilltop Lakes Board of Directors.

We would like to say how appreciative we are of the cooperation we receive from everyone during the frost delays by remaining off the course during that time. By keeping everyone off the course while frost is on the ground it allows us to prevent damage from occurring to the grass on the course. Keeping the course in excellent condition is a major goal of ours that we strive to accomplish daily.

We want to remind everyone that we still have two holes a month which are designated as cart path only. This has been recommended by the USGA in order to improve the grass on the fairways. Signs are posted at the designated holes, at the Pro Shop, and on rental carts. Hole 18 is cart path only at all times.

We want to thank all the volunteers who helped cut down and haul off the dead trees which were along the golf course.

We would also like to thank DR Lewis for providing us with the railroad ties which were used to build the

bulk head at the blue tee on hole 15.

Our crew is working on extending the green on hole 7 and have already sanded and painted the tee markers. Some other projects that we have been working on include spray pre-emerge herbicide/fungicide on the course, fertilize greens/tees, and aerify/topdress greens.

We hope that everyone comes out and enjoys the course this Spring and Summer. See you there!
